Expectations....

- I am as Parent/ Guardian responsible for making appropriate arrangements for bringing my child to rehearsal and for their safe return home afterwards. I will let the organiser know if my child is going to be allowed to walk home alone or be collected by another parent/friend. I will also make similar arrangements for performances as required.
- *Punctuality* is essential in adhering to our rehearsal and performance schedule. Be early for everything and help each other stay organised.
- Every effort should be made to attend all rehearsals and concerts. Parents must endeavour to provide at least a weeks' notice of non attendance. All non attendance should be notified to LBA Musical Director either via phone, email or in person.
- The priority of the Academy is to the personal health and safety of all members in regards to any association activity.
- The Academy shall ensure that the premises are used safely for all members and visitors, insofar as the association activities are concerned.
- All Academy members have a responsibility for their own and others' safety, and should conduct themselves in a responsible manner to meet health and safety.
- The use of mobile phones is not permitted in rehearsals.
- Vulgar or irreverent speech or action and profane behavior will not be tolerated at any time.
- Each LBA member is responsible for all his/her own equipment and personal items (triple check for uniform, Music, valve oil, availability of mutes, Percussion equipment etc.).
- When in performance and in public view, remain in full performance attire
 unless exceptions are made at the time by your Musical Director. It is
 unprofessional to have shirt tails out, to wear athletic shoes while in
 performance attire, to chew gum, etc.
